



UltraSync™ Doorbell Camera Installation Guide

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Product overview

This is the installation guide for the following UltraSync IP camera models:

- RS-3240 (1080p IP Wi-Fi Doorbell IR camera, US)
- RS-3241 (1080p IP Wi-Fi Doorbell IR camera, EMEA)


Installation environment

When installing the product, consider these factors:


- **Electrical:** The doorbell camera may only be connected to a mechanical doorbell that uses 16-24 VAC power. The camera does not support digital doorbells. The doorbell wire needs to be 20 AWG (0.811 mm) in diameter to 18 AWG (1.02 mm) in diameter for power transmission. Do not use a wire size less than 20 AWG (0.811 mm) in diameter. Contact a qualified electrician to properly wire the doorbell camera according to national and local wiring code.
- **Included transformer:** RS-3241 includes an input 230 VAC/50 Hz transformer.
- **Wi-Fi:** The doorbell camera is only compatible with 2.4 GHz networks. Ensure that the location planned for the installation of the camera is able to receive a -65 dBm or better Wi-Fi signal.
- **Network:** We recommend an upstream bandwidth of at least 768 kbps for each camera to connect to the internet.
- **Ventilation:** Ensure that the location planned for the installation of the camera is well ventilated.

- **Temperature:** Do not operate the camera beyond the specified temperature, humidity, or power source ratings. The operating temperature of the camera is between -30 to +50°C (-22 to 122°F). Humidity is below 90%.
- **Moisture:** Do not expose the camera to rain or moisture, or try to operate it in wet areas. Moisture can damage the camera and also create the danger of electric shock.
- **Servicing:** Do not attempt to service this camera yourself. Any attempt to dismantle this product invalidates the warranty and may also result in serious injury. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.
- **Cleaning:** Do not touch the sensor modules with fingers. If cleaning is necessary, use a clean cloth with some ethanol and wipe the camera gently.
- **Reflectivity:** Ensure that there is no reflective surface too close to the camera lens. The IR light from the camera may reflect back into the lens causing reflection.

Camera description—front and rear




1. Microphone

Doorbell camera LED indicator

The following table describes the doorbell camera LED behavior (see item 4 in “Camera description—front and rear” on page 3). The LED indicator can be turned on or off using the UltraSync SmartHome app.



Accessing the Micro SD card

A 16 GB Micro SD card is pre-installed in the camera. Micro SD cards with up to 128 GB of storage capacity can also be used.

Note: Video and log files stored on the Micro SD card can only be accessed using the UltraSync App when validated with the UltraSync Panel.

To access the Micro SD card slot, remove the cover on the side of the camera.



Installation Step 1


Before mounting the doorbell camera:

- Ensure that the doorbell's power supply is shut off during the physical installation/camera mounting.
- Ensure that the existing doorbell has been removed with all wires disconnected.

Installation Step 2

To mount the doorbell camera:

1. With the rear of the doorbell assembly facing down, place your index fingers on top of the notches on the back of the faceplate and gently pull it straight back to remove it from the assembly.
2. Align the cable hole on the mounting template with the cable hole on the mounting surface.
3. *If mounting the doorbell on a stucco, concrete, or brick surface:* Drill wall anchor holes according to the drill template using the appropriate drill bit. Press each anchor into the wall after drilling the holes.



If installing the doorbell on a wood surface or into siding: proceed to “Installation Step 3” on page 8 (proceed to step 4 if using an angle bracket).

4. *If using an angle bracket:* Place the flat surface of the bracket against the wall and thread the existing doorbell wiring through the cable hole on the bracket.


Note: The up/down bracket and the left/right bracket can be turned to better angle the camera

Installation Step 3

To connect the doorbell camera to power:

1. Connect the existing doorbell wiring to the rear of the doorbell assembly. The two wires can be connected to either terminal on the rear of the assembly. The doorbell wire needs to be 20 AWG (0.811 mm) in diameter to 18 AWG (1.02 mm) in diameter for power transmission up to 100 ft. (30 m). Do not use a wire size less than 20 AWG (0.811 mm) in diameter. Contact a qualified electrician to properly wire the doorbell camera according to national and local wiring code.
2. *If the existing wires are not long enough to properly connect the doorbell camera:* Use the included connectors and wires to extend the existing wires. Insert the wires into the connector and then tighten the screws until the wire connection is secured.

WARNING: Connect the included resistor to the doorbell if no electrical or mechanical chime is connected. We recommend soldering the resistor to the wire, using electrical tape or sleeve to prevent short circuits, and placing the transformer and resistor in a metal electrical box. Consult a licensed electrician to properly wire the circuit.



Installation Step 4

To finish installing the doorbell camera:

1. Route the cables and insert the cables and power connector into the wall.
2. Align the screw holes on the doorbell body with the drilled holes, wall anchors, or angle bracket.
3. Mount the doorbell body to the wall or angle bracket using the two screws provided.
4. Affix the faceplate to the doorbell body using the security screw and security screw wrench provided.
5. Turn the power supply to the doorbell camera back on and proceed to “Getting started.”

To remove a mounted faceplate:

1. Remove the security screw using the wrench provided.
2. Place both thumbs on top of the faceplate and your fingers on the bottom of the faceplate.
3. Squeeze the faceplate and gently pull it straight back to remove it from the doorbell assembly.

Getting started

Before setting up the doorbell camera for use, follow all of the installation steps and ensure that the doorbell camera is powered on (doorbell LED should be slowly blinking blue).

Note: For detailed information on how to set up the UltraSync app, add locations, and log in as an installer, see the *UltraSync Hub Reference Guide*.

To install the UltraSync app and activate the doorbell:

1. With your mobile device connected to Wi-Fi, download and install the UltraSync + app (appears as UltraSync Home after download).



or



2. Open the UltraSync app and log in as an installer on the specific site.
3. Tap the menu icon at the top left of the screen, and then tap **New Device Setup**.
4. Follow the on-screen prompts from the app to do the following:
 - Connect your mobile device to the camera.
 - Set up a camera user name and password.
 - Sync the camera to the UltraSync hub.
 - Change camera names and view camera status.

Note: Please enter a password for the camera. The password must contain 8 to 16 characters, include an upper case and lower case letter, and a special character (-, ., * & @ / \$?). It can also include numbers and spaces.

Operating the doorbell

Use the UltraSync SmartHome app to perform doorbell camera functions.



Video two-way communication

When the doorbell button is pressed, you can receive a notification via the app, get the live view from the doorbell camera, and start a two-way voice communication with the visitor.

Live view

Launch the app to get a live view of the connected devices.

Playback

Launch the app and access a connected device to play back video.

Recording

Record any event-triggered video such as motion detection video with the doorbell camera.

Alarm notification

Launch the UltraSync app to see alarm messages.

Add camera to the network via WPS

A WPS-enabled wireless router is required to add a camera using the WPS function.

1. Press the WPS button on the router.
2. Within 120 seconds of pressing the WPS button on the router, press the WPS button on the camera for approximately five seconds. See “Camera description—sides and top” on page 4 for the WPS button location.
3. The blue LED on the camera flashes rapidly to indicate that it has started the WPS process. A white LED illuminates when the camera has joined the wireless network.

TruVision Device Manager

The TruVision[®] Device Manager is standalone software that can discover TruVision IP devices on a network.

In addition to finding device IP addresses, the camera password can be activated, IP settings can be changed, and camera firmware can be updated using Device Manager.

Troubleshooting

Troubleshooting/FAQ	
1.	The camera does not power on, regularly loses the connection, or stops working after a few events.
Cause	Solution
The camera does not have enough power to run correctly.	<p><i>The camera requires a 16-24 VAC power supply to run correctly. The long length or the age of the wires may also affect the power received by the camera.</i></p> <p><i>The doorbell wire needs to be 20 AWG (0.811 mm) in diameter to 18 AWG (1.02 mm) in diameter for power transmission up to 100 ft. (30 m). Do not use a wire size less than 20 AWG (0.811 mm) in diameter.</i></p>
	<p><i>Ensure that there are no other devices (such as an address light box) connected to the transformer.</i></p>
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <i>1. Measure the transformer AC voltage without the doorbell camera connected. A typical 16 VAC doorbell transformer generates between 18 and 21 VAC when measured in an open circuit with the doorbell button removed or not pressed. Ensure that there is at least 20 VAC at the doorbell wires. If not, change the doorbell transformer to 24 VAC 20 VA.</i> <i>2. After installing the doorbell camera, measure the AC voltage across the two terminal screws. It should read at least 19 VAC when it is fully</i>

	<p><i>powered on.</i></p> <p>3. <i>Measure the voltage after turning on night vision mode, motion detection recording, and starting two-way audio. It should read at least 17 VAC when all the functions are enabled. With night vision mode and motion detection recording on, press the doorbell button on the camera to measure the voltage. The doorbell should operate without interruption. If the doorbell camera experiences an interruption or significant voltage drop, change the transformer to 24 VAC 20 VA.</i></p>
2.	The camera does not appear in the list of Wi-Fi networks.
Cause	Solution
The camera takes up to 90 seconds to boot up.	<i>Wait until the camera boots up and the LED slowly blinks blue before checking the Wi-Fi list.</i>
Another user is currently setting up the camera using the recommended method or the camera has previously been set up using the recommended method.	<i>Perform a factory reset by holding the WPS/RESET button for 15 seconds to rebroadcast the camera.</i>
The network signal is less than -65dB.	<i>If Wi-Fi connection speeds are poor, we recommend moving the Wi-Fi router or using a Wi-Fi repeater to increase signal strength.</i>

3.	The camera does not add to the UltraSync network when Scan for Cameras is selected.	
Cause		Solution
The camera will not work if the devices are not on the same network.		<i>Ensure that the camera and the UltraSync Hub panel are on the same network. The LED illuminates solid white. The camera only supports the 2.4 GHz wireless network with WPA2 AES security protocol. It does not support 5 GHz wireless networks. The camera LED color illuminates solid blue if it is not connect to a wireless network.</i>
UltraSync Hub must be using IP to work with the cameras.		<i>Ensure that the UltraSync Hub panel is not installed using a cellular radio only.</i>
Ensure that cameras are not being added to a network that already has a high number of cameras installed on the same network. This is unusual, but may be common in testing environments.		<i>Put UltraSync Hub and the cameras on their own router.</i>

4.	The camera was added in the setup process, but the video doesn't show in the Cameras tab.	
Cause		Solution
After completing the setup process, the camera may take up to two minutes to appear in the UltraSync app.		<i>Wait for the process to complete</i>
		<i>Make sure the camera is still connected to the network. The LED indicator illuminates solid White when connected successfully. If the LED indicator illuminates solid blue, reset the camera back to factory default and repeat the setup.</i>
		<i>Ensure that the wireless network is set to use WPA2 AES security protocol.</i>
		<i>If video still doesn't appear, go back into setup and perform the "Scan for Cameras" function.</i>
5.	Live Video quality is poor. It is choppy, shows gray, etc.	
Cause		Solution
Ensure that the camera's Wi-Fi and/or Ethernet connection speeds are adequate (768 Kbps minimum).		<i>If Wi-Fi connection speeds are poor, we recommend using a Wi-Fi repeater to increase signal strength.</i>
The camera's default settings are set up to work on a strong home network.		<i>In some cases, low video settings may be required to achieve a smooth video. Change to SD mode from the mobile app.</i>

6.	Video clips take a long time to load.	
	Cause	Solution
	The camera's default settings are configured to have video clips start playing in the UltraSync app within 15 seconds (on a strong network). If default settings were changed to longer clip times or higher video quality, the amount of time needed to access the clip increases.	<i>Lower the quality or length of clips to shorten load times.</i>
7.	Two way audio quality is poor. It is delayed or noisy.	
	Cause	Solution
	The camera's default settings are set up to work on a strong home network.	<i>In some cases, a low video setting may required to achieve adequate two-way audio performance. Change to SD mode or adjust the speaker or microphone settings from the mobile app.</i>
	The camera's Wi-Fi connection speeds are not adequate (768 kbps minimum).	<i>If Wi-Fi connection speeds are poor, we recommend using a Wi-Fi repeater to increase signal strength.</i>
8.	Image is too dark to see due to the environment.	
	Cause	Solution
	Shadow in the foreground or bright sunlight in the background.	<i>Adjust the brightness and contrast settings in the camera.</i>

9.	The notification or the bell ring is delayed or not shown.	
	Cause	Solution
	The camera receives too many event notifications at the same time.	<i>Enable the doorbell button press or motion detection notification. Adjust the motion detection area and sensitivity for the event notification. Adjust the pre- and post-clip timing. Disable HD recorded clips option to record the clip in SD mode. Reboot the camera through the mobile app if necessary.</i>
	The camera's Wi-Fi connection speeds are not adequate (768 kbps minimum).	<i>If Wi-Fi connection speeds are poor, we recommend using a Wi-Fi repeater to increase signal strength.</i>
